ABOUT US

Nevada Food at First is a free meal program that started in Spring 2009 to care for those who hunger. Households order carry-out meals for pick up at Neighborhood Meal Stop locations in Eastern Story County. Beginning Monday, October 6, new meal stops will be located at Collins-Maxwell Elementary School and Collins-Maxwell Middle/High School.

VOLUNTEER SPECIALS

We welcome individuals, households, and groups of volunteers to help address food insecurity. Volunteers of all ages are welcome! Scheduling is organized by the position of the day in each month (i.e. 1st/3rd Mondays). Everyone associated with Nevada Food at First builds relationships and genuinely care for their neighbors by making free meals available on Mondays and Thursdays.

MONDAYS AND THURSDAYS

Neighborhood Meal Stop Drivers

Volunteers pick up meals in Nevada between 5:20-5:45 PM for delivery at either C-M Elementary (Collins) by 6:00 PM or C-M Middle/High School (Maxwell) at 6:15 PM. On-call (substitute) volunteer drivers are also needed.

Meal Assembly and Packing

Volunteers meet at Nevada First United Methodist Church from 4:30-6 PM to assemble and pack meals ordered for delivery.

Meal Preparation

Volunteers meet at Nevada First United Methodist Church beginning at 2:00 PM to prepare the meal.

EXTRAS

Food Rescue Volunteers

Volunteers go to stores, including Dollar Fresh, Dollar General, and DG Market in Nevada and Crumbl cookies in Ames, to receive donated food that would otherwise be thrown away. This food is used to prepare the free carry-out meals twice a week and is distributed to Eastern Story County school and community food pantries. Food rescue volunteers are scheduled by day and time (i.e. Wednesdays at 10:30 AM) for 60-90 minutes.
