As I learn and gain a better understanding of the District, I will work hard to collaborate with the school board, staff, students, parents, and other stakeholders to make the best decisions possible to move the District forward.

To end, the beginning of each school year brings a new level of excitement. I have had the opportunity to meet some of you already and have received a warm welcome. The first day of school will be on Monday, August 26th. I know our staff will be ready to welcome students back into the buildings. Until then, take some time to relax and enjoy all that summer has to offer. I am going to continue to get acclimated as the new superintendent as we embark on a new school year. Ninety alumni and guests attended. Out-of-state classmates were from Texas, Colorado, Arizona, Nebraska and Pennsylvania.

Three \$500 scholarships were awarded to: Emma Pasquariello, Vivian Kahler and Sophie Comegys. Emma and Vivian's scholarships were from the Maxwell Alumni Association. Sophie's scholarship was from the Dr. Lawrence Birchmier family in memory of Lawrence who passed away in 2023. Lawrence was a veterinarian at Mitchellville and graduated with the Class of 1952. The scholarship winners were all National Honor Society members and each earned her silver cord for 200 hours of volunteer work. They all graduated with an honors diploma with a GPA of 3.5 or higher.
