




Preschool News


MS. Rob's Math Update

7th Grade: Your students were given the task of rescuing Fred the Worm using only two paper clips and a life preserver made of gummy worms (life savers). The goal was to work together and find a way to maneuver the worm into the life preserver using the limited resources provided.

Currently, the 7th grade is learning about integers and rational number operations. I am very impressed with their knowledge, ability to work together, and spunk in the classroom!









Currently, 8th grade is learning about how to transform repeating decimals into fractions, root functions, and integer exponents! They are learning to work with partners and how to struggle to succeed! I am very proud of their accomplishments so far this school year.



Geometry: Your students were given the task of building the tallest structure with toothpicks and marshmallows. The goal of this was to work together, keep the structure standing, take turns adding the toothpicks/marshmallows, and then it had to stay standing for 60 seconds after they let go! We had a few topple over.

The geometry students have learned more vocabulary for math than I think they knew possible! There is even more to come! They are learning to look at math differently through proofwriting. They are already well into their 2nd unit and will finish it the last week of the 1st quarter,.





Pre-Algebra: Your students were also tasked to build the tallest index card castle they could by taking turns placing each index card. They could fold the index cards however they wished but couldn't tear them. The goal was to work together to keep the castle standing upright and working off of the person before them's ideas and work. This task requires great teamwork and patience!




Currently, the Pre-Algebra students are Learning about the Real Number System: operations with integer and rational numbers, fractions, scientific notation, integer exponents, conversions, root operations, and comparing/ordering number forms.



This year CM MS/HS has been engaging in Career Based Learning several Mondays per month. MS students have been working on career exploration and digital citizenship. These would include interest inventories, time management, discovering their learning style, and study skills and habits.

HS students are also working on Career Exploration with more of a focus on finding several career pathways that they would like to research and possibly pursue. HS students also are making choices on guest speakers that have volunteered to speak to our students. These speakers are sharing their backgrounds, college and training, daily work environment, and advice they have for HS students just starting out.


